\$138 **Million** Gap **Closed** \$16.5 Million Cap


# Operating Fund Designated Balances & Reserves

(\$ in billions)




#### Designated Balances & Reserves Operating Fund as of June 30, 2024

(\$ in millions)




#### Cal Poly Operating Fund Designated Balances and Reserves


# **2024-25 State Budget Highlights Impacting CSU Operations**

\$240 million ongoing increase

\$75 million one-time reduction

### 2024-25 Budget Situation

 Implementing additional cost reduction strategies, use of balances & reserves, increase enrollment

- Three main challenges:
  - 1. Funding gap
  - 2. Compensation costs
  - 3. Enrollment





### **Ongoing Fiscal Challenges**

- Negative impacts on academic offerings and support services to students
- Potential redirection of existing campus funding for employee compensation commitments
- CSU priorities not funded
- Federal and state compliance, legislative mandates and compact expectations
- Critical capital renewal backlog, academic facilities and infrastructure projects
- Inflationary effects

### FY 2024-25 Process – Key Dates

- February 2024 Cal Poly Enrollment Targets approved
- March 2024 May 2024 Campus enters initial budget plans utilizing existing resources
- May 2024 Vice Presidents submit Division Priorities
- June 2024 Cabinet presentation on Divisional Requests
- June 2024 August 2024 Executive Budget Allocation Group meets to review requests and priorities
- July 2024 Cal Poly received notification of final state allocations (June approved budget)
- September 2024 Final Budget approved



#### FY 2024-25 Process – Guidelines for Review

- A shared concept that we will take care of our existing employees as much as possible
- Evaluation of a Return on Investment (where relevant)
- Priority given to requests related to compliance and regulatory needs as part of our mandatory costs and those that minimize Cal Poly's exposure to risk
- As we strive to achieve organizational efficiency and effectiveness, we will fund the core operations of that office first, as we work on governance and guidelines prior to funding any related initiatives across campus.
  - Divisional budgets are subject to review and adjustments, which may lead to reallocations
- Understanding of moving forward with a planned central budget deficit over the next three years as we continue moving on Strategic Initiatives, as we leverage future growth funding



# 2025-26 and Beyond Budget Situation State Leader Intentions

7.95% reduction to CSU (\$397M) for FY2025-26

- Compact deferral of years 4 & 5 (FY2025-26 & FY2026-27)
  - Bridge funding using CSU funds, then reimbursed



## 2025-26 and Beyond Budget Situation State Leader Intentions

2025-26 State cuts -\$397 million ongoing

CSU spends \$252 million one-time

2026-27 State reimburses \$252 million one-time

State appropriates \$252 million ongoing (year 4 of compact)

CSU spends \$264 million one-time

2027-28 State reimburses \$264 million one-time

State appropriates \$264 million ongoing (year 5 of compact)



(\$ in billions)







# Budgeted & Forecasted Operating Fund Gaps (\$ in billions)





### **System-wide Considerations**

#### **State Intent**

Reduction in 25-26; Increases in 26-27 and 27-28

#### **Preliminary Budget Gap for 2025-26**

- Potential revenue & use of one-time funds = -\$210 million
- Potential expenditure priorities = \$602 million
- Ongoing budget gap from 2024-25 = \$218 million
- Preliminary budget gap of \$1 billion



### **Key Takeaways**

#### **State Decisions**

- \$240 million ongoing increase for 24-25
- One-time \$75 million reduction in 24-25
- State budget reductions expected in 25-26




