The Cal Poly Transition Plan sets priorities for the removal of barriers. The plan also acknowledges that not all barriers can be removed and recognizes that needs, priorities and programs may change. Therefore the campus is dedicated to rapid response to newly identified needs for access and barrier removal. When programmatic access needs arise that were not anticipated or prioritized by the transition plan, Facility Services will re-prioritize and act quickly to remove barriers and provide access in areas not previously identified as a priority; as it has done many times in the past.

Barriers identified as not to be removed in this Transition Plan may be removed under the following additional circumstances;

- 1 Removal work is triggered by being part of an upgrade project or in its Path of Travel.
- 2 Removal work is requested by an individual or group.
- 3 Removal work is accomplished by routine maintenance.

Facility Use Notes

Priority 3 - Defined broadly as not being a 1, 2 or 4.

Priority 4 - Shops with no student access, warehouses, kitchens, mechanical/electrical rooms and similar spaces.

Severity Notes

Priority 1 - Blocks Access to a significant number of people with Disabilities.

Priority 2 - Major inconvenience to a significant number of people with disabilities and blocks access for some.

Priority 3 - Minor inconvenience to most people with disabilities, major to few, blocks almost none.

Priority 4 - Minor inconvenience to some people with disabilities, major to almost none, blocks none. Or; Complies with original ADA guidelines. Or; Complies with Federal requirements but does not meet stricter state or local requirements.
