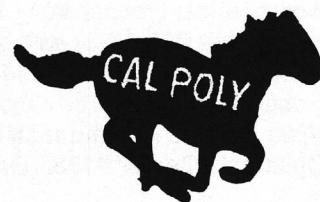

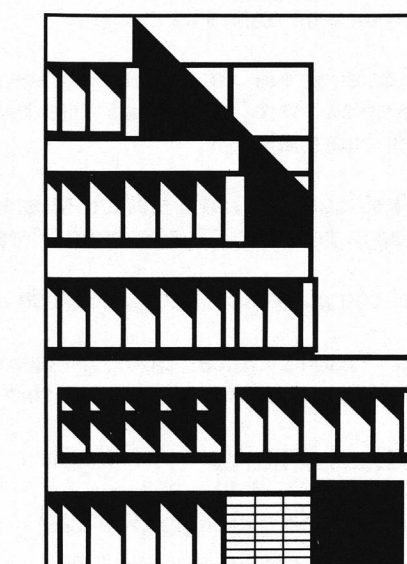
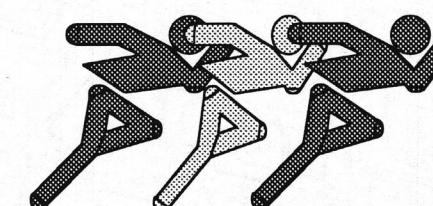

Full name: California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo
Usually referred to as: Cal Poly
Location: At San Luis Obispo -- about 230 miles south of San Francisco, 200 miles north of Los Angeles, 10 miles from the Pacific Ocean
Affiliation: Part of the 20-campus California State University system
Emphasis: Undergraduate technical and professional education
Guiding philosophy: Learn by doing
President: Warren J. Baker
Student body: About 15,700

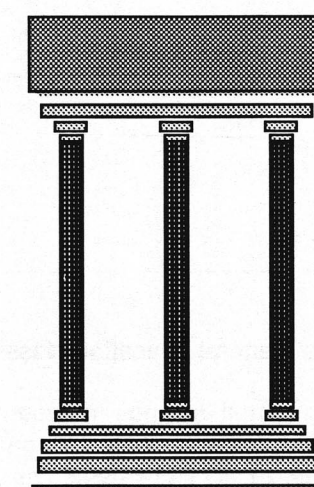

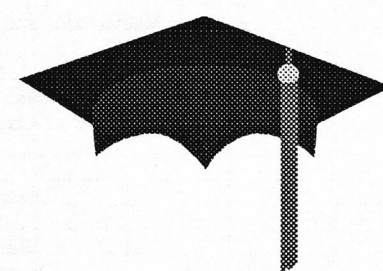


FACILITIES
