BEACoN Research Scholars	 BEACoN provides the opportunity for students to be mentored and work with a faculty member on a research project. Matched 61 students from a variety of disciplines with 53 faculty mentors from across campus. Paid students a competitive stipend equivalent to \$20/hour for 10 hours/week for Winter and Spring Quarters, to allow them to pursue this opportunity. Research projects lead to conference presentations and published works, which creates academic opportunities for pursuing masters or doctoral degrees. Provided workshops and trainings for student participants and hosted weekly coffee hours with BEACoN Interns. Created BEACoN Travel Fund and sponsored current and prior BEACON students to attend conferences to present their research or further education in their field. Hosted Winter and Spring Kick-Off meetings and a culminating Research Symposium during Finals Week where all students presented research posters of their work. 	\$151,600	61
