



COVID-19 Guidelines for Vendors

PURPOSE

The health and safety of our students, staff, and faculty, as well as their families are of the utmost importance to Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo. In accordance with federal, state and local guidance, the university has taken steps to prevent and control the spread of COVID-19 on campus and as such, vendors delivering goods and performing services on campus shall adhere to the following guidelines:

VENDOR GUIDELINES

1. All vendors working on campus or other University property must comply with the California Department of Industrial Relations' (Cal/OSHA) COVID-19 Revised Emergency Temporary Standard. Vendors and contractors must also comply with Assembly Bill 685's amendments to the California Labor Code Section's 6325, 6409.6 and 6432 for the effective dates indicated therein.
2. All vendors are expected to comply with the guidelines established by San Luis Obispo County and the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).
3. All vendors must wear proper PPE required by current public health orders and/or the university while on university property.
4. Face Coverings Requirements - Cal Poly strongly recommends, but does not require, masks be worn indoors, regardless of vaccination status. Masks are still required for all in health care settings. Our experts continue to recommend surgical masks, KN95s, and N95s as the standard for our community. For more information, visit <https://coronavirus.calpoly.edu/face-coverings>.
5. If any vendors feel ill, have symptoms of COVID-19, or have COVID-19, they are to not visit the university.
6. Vendor shall comply, and shall ensure its employees, agents, and subcontractors comply, with CSU's COVID-19 Vaccination Interim Policy, ID 9779821, located at <https://calstate.policystat.com/policy/9779821/latest/>, or with such CSU COVID-19 Vaccination Policy as may be in effect at the time Vendor, its employees, agents, and/or subcontractors seek to enter CSU Property. Moreover, Vendor agrees to reasonably cooperate with CSU to ensure its compliance and that of its employees, agents, and subcontractors with any applicable CSU COVID-19 Vaccination Policy. CSU reserves the right to modify or rescind the CSU COVID-19 Vaccination Interim Policy and/or any other related policy at any time based on federal, state, and/or local public health guidance.
